Nonprofit Transparency

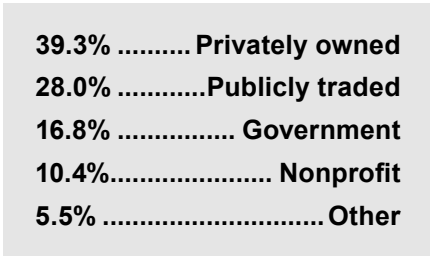
Nonprofit organizations are and should be held to a high standard of accountability. After all, by design they benefit the public, so nonprofits should be transparent in their operations. More than any private company, nonprofits are open for scrutiny.

Certain nonprofit practices are required by law, and others simply demonstrate a nonprofit's transparency to the public. Taken as a whole, these practices will not guarantee that an organization is operating most effectively and efficiently, but one can be assured that it has strong oversight. These practices are outlined by the National Council on Nonprofits in an article entitled "Cultivating a Culture of Accountability and Transparency" (<http://www.councilofnonprofits.org/resources/resources-topic/ethics-accountability/cultivating-culture-accountability-and-transparency>).

- IRS public disclosure requirements demand that nonprofits make available copies of its Form 1023 (its application for tax-exemption) and its annual IRS Form 990 filing.
- Published financial information on a nonprofit's website, such as the Form 1023, IRS Form 990, audited financial statements, and annual report.
- Organizational policies on whistleblower, conflict of interest, executive compensation, internal controls, expense reimbursement, and other financial management policies.
- Adherence to the Association of Fundraising Professionals Code of Ethics in all fundraising practices.
- Regular board review of current financial statements.

Despite these efforts to demonstrate accountability and transparency to the general public, fiscal mismanagement

and fraud occur, and when they do, it frequently becomes headline news. Are nonprofits fraught with fraud? Not according to the Association of Certified Fraud Examiners in its 2012 Report to the Nations on Occupational Fraud and Abuse. It shows that just about 10 percent of reported fraud occurs in nonprofits:



A commonly held argument about nonprofits is that they don't operate like businesses, and they would be better off if

The Overhead Myth: Embracing the Business of Philanthropy

The good news for the nonprofit sector is 2013 is the year people started addressing “the overhead myth” in a meaningful way. The bad news is nonprofits need to adopt a unified front to debunk overhead costs as the best measure of effectiveness, which may not be in the best interests of individual nonprofits in the short-term.

To effectively execute its programs a nonprofit must spend money on management to plan and build the infrastructure of the organization and fundraising to cover program and management expenses. Money spent on these two activities – managing an organization and generating income – is known as “overhead”. The “overhead myth” is that money spent on these activities is wasteful and donors should avoid funding these activities. The issue is further oversimplified by using the ratio of overhead expenses to all expenses as the single greatest determinant of a nonprofit’s effectiveness.

Whether or not you work in the nonprofit sector you’ve probably heard some of the following sentiments: “How much of my money actually goes to programs?” “If it were really a charity the people would work there for free.” “If they can afford to mail me a fundraising letter, they don’t need my money.” These thoughts all stem from the perception that nonprofits don’t spend money effectively. A BBB Wise Giving Alliance survey found 62% of Americans believe nonprofits spend

too much on overhead. Along with the complex social issues nonprofits address, we also must contend with the general perception that most nonprofits don’t run businesses well.

Over time, this has led to a sector that overtly cannibalizes itself by juxtaposing individual success with a myth we know is self-destructive. Every time a nonprofit trumpets a low overhead percentage, the myth that nonprofits are generally inefficient is given greater authority. The nonprofit sector is caught in a self-defeating cycle and it is time to make a collective effort to fight “the overhead myth.”

Three Major Myth Busters

The first signal of changing times was when Dan Pallota’s March 2013 TED Talk, “The way we think about charity is dead wrong”, went viral. In his talk, Pallota questions why a ratio has become so much more important than results. He argues that a small nonprofit with a 3% overhead raising \$10,000 for the hungry should not be considered more effective than a fundraising nonprofit with 40-50% overhead that raises \$100,000,000 for the hungry. He rhetorically asks, “Although donors are taught to value the low overhead percentage, what would the hungry prefer?” This highlights a key contradiction of using the overhead ratio as a measure of success: as funders want us to focus more on outcomes than outputs, our primary measure of success is still based on a calculation of outputs. Pallota asks us to consider whether equating morality with frugality when it comes to nonprofit financial decision-making is an effective way to solve large-scale problems.

In June 2013 came a second high profile

effort to change donors’ perception of infrastructure costs. GuideStar, Charity Navigator, the BBB Wise Giving Alliance issued a joint letter to the American people titled, “The Overhead Myth.” The three most accessed sources of information about nonprofits said it simply, “The percent of charity expenses that go to administrative and fundraising costs—commonly referred to as “overhead”—is a poor measure of a charity’s performance.” The groups went a step further to suggest that most nonprofits should actually spend more on overhead. The letter included the following language nonprofits should use to translate the concept of overhead to donors: “Overhead costs include important investments charities make to improve their work: investments in training, planning, evaluation, and internal systems—as well as their efforts to raise money so they can operate their programs.” It says a lot about the nonprofit industry and our “watchdog” counterparts that making the case for running a strong business was revolutionary.

Back in 2009, Stanford Social Innovation Review published an article titled, “The Nonprofit Starvation Cycle”, which was highlighted in the “The Overhead Myth” letter. The article exposes the self-defeating cycle in which nonprofits participate. The first step is the unrealistic perception of overhead costs held by many donors and funders. The second step is pressure to conform to the expectations. The next step is the nonprofit response: “They spend too little on overhead, and they underreport their expenditures on tax forms and in fun-

draising materials. This underspending and underreporting in turn perpetuates funders' unrealistic expectations." This leads to donors and funders continually expecting nonprofits to do "more and more with less and less – a cycle that slowly starves nonprofits."

These three developments in breaking the overhead myth were groundbreaking for nonprofits. The sector finally had external voices arguing that infrastructure is a necessary part of a good business; even, if not especially, businesses dedicated to long-term social benefit rather than short-term profit reports.

Smart Overhead is Good Business

In the private sector, overhead is similarly made up of as "SG&A" (sales, general, and administrative) and is viewed as a necessary element of doing good business. Different industries have different tolerable ranges of overhead percentages and it is accepted those ratios will fluctuate over the course of the business lifecycle. While you endeavor keep these percentages low, you also make space for R&D, building your human capital, and the cost of launching new products and acquiring new customers. If you didn't spend money on these things, you would be considered a poor business leader.

Imagine you have a friend who is asking you to invest in her new pottery business. Being a smart investor, you ask her a few questions about her management perspective.

"I see you're naming your store 'Poverty Pottery'. That's an interesting name. Did you get any marketing advice before developing your brand?"

"On no... It's not about the brand; it's about the pottery."

"How are you going to get the word out about your business?"

"I don't think it's right to waste money on advertising that could be used making pottery. I'll set up a Facebook page. Maybe I'll get some friends to set up a table at street fairs on weekends and hand out flyers."

"What kind of technology are using to track sales?"

"Software is very expensive! There is an amazing option that exists but I would rather spend money on the pot-

tery. When in doubt, more pottery! We are pretty resourceful about plugging holes. We'll cobble together some Excel sheets for now."

"The industry you are working in is extremely complex. In fact, no one has ever solved poverty, I mean pottery. How did you find the right people on your staff?"

"I've found that people with experience in pottery are incredibly expensive. I look for people with a can-do spirit and pay them very little. They don't stay very long but there are a lot of people who feel strongly about pottery so I can replace them fairly quickly."

"What are you going to do with my financial investment?"

"Well, I absolutely assure you I won't invest it in building the infrastructure of my business. 100% will go to pottery. That's how effective I am."

"How are you going to keep this business going with so many challenges?"

"That's the beauty of it! I pay myself last and work double shifts when needed. This business doesn't work without some sacrifices at the top. It's a stretch sometimes but you can count on me."

"Let me think about this for a day or two. I mean, it is beautiful pottery."

After this conversation, it would be clear you were being asked to invest in a business that is destined to fail. Yet, in the nonprofit industry, the answers above are the functional norms for too many organizations. Spend as little money as possible on infrastructure. Only invest in improvements when they are absolutely necessarily and fully funded. Money spent on overhead is money wasted. Continually get leaner or your donors will leave you.

What We Can Do to Debunk the Overhead Myth

1. Stop Spreading It!

Nonprofits have been our own worst enemy by embracing the overhead myth when it suits us. Every time a nonprofit trumpets its low overhead it is tacitly buying-in to low overhead as the most legitimate measure of quality operations. It's time to stop focusing on how little we

spend and start focusing on how much we accomplish. Less reporting on ratios, more reporting on results.

This includes Community Shares. We are rated 4-Stars by Charity Navigator and only 10% of nonprofits achieve this rating for three consecutive years. Unless significant changes are made to their rating system, I will make the case to my board and staff we should stop highlighting our rating in 2014 or couch it on an educational page about the importance of infrastructure.

2. Translate the Jargon

Explain to your donors what we are actually doing when we are accumulating big, bad, overhead. Point out smart uses of administrative and management time and funding. Highlight short-term wins and the importance of long-term planning.

3. Think Long Term

Identify specific donors (e.g., small business owners, entrepreneurs) that may prefer to support you as investors in infrastructure improvements. They may even want to play a

collaborative role in identifying long-term operations improvements.

In the end, we're all in this industry together. When we buy-in to overhead as a good measure of our effectiveness, we place limits on ambition and innovation. By banding together to push for a deeper understanding of the business of philanthropy, we invite funders to think with greater complexity about our work and the type of investments necessary to make meaningful change.

2013 Quality of Life Indicators Report

The sixth edition of the *Quality of Life Indicators Report for the Pikes Peak Region* was released in October 2013 for use by elected officials, business and community leaders, nonprofit and advocacy groups, and individual citizens in order to make data-driven decisions and create strategic solutions. The mission of this effort stands firm — to become a trusted, unbiased source of strategically-relevant information for the entire Pikes Peak region, which includes both El Paso and Teller counties.

This year, eleven sectors were covered: Arts & Culture, Built Environment, Community Engagement, Economy, Education, Health, Natural Environment, Recreation, Safety, Social Wellbeing, and Transportation.

From these eleven sectors, five top trends affecting the quality of life in our community were identified:

Economy

According to the Milken Institute, Colorado Springs jumped from 99 to

57 out of 200 best performing large cities in 2012 for job creation, economic performance and the high-tech sector. However, a long-term stagnant economic trend coupled with a national recession continues to impact many aspects of life in the Pikes Peak Region, creating a ripple effect on poverty levels, health care access, demand for basic needs assistance and a host of other effects.

Community Engagement

Most notable success: banding together as a community. Two recent devastating fires made history for the tremendous toll taken on lives, homes and open spaces. An outpouring of community support and generosity for first responders and evacuees, and the determination and cooperation of volunteers, local governments, area non-profits and regional businesses achieved a swift and effective recovery.

Fire and Flood

The two destructive wildfires that

swept through Pikes Peak region neighborhoods in 2012 and 2013 resulted in loss of life, hundreds of homes, open spaces and considerable dollars, and affected multiple quality of life indicators. Effectively managing the fire threat includes the need for intensive mitigation practices near homes and businesses and ongoing discussion about the cost, risks and values of building in the wildland-urban interface.

Health and Hospital Systems

Though our region retains its high marks for recreational opportunities and participation, we are trending toward being less active and less healthy with an increase in obesity rates, a decrease in the number of primary care physicians and psychiatrists, and an elevated suicide rate. However, positive indicators focus on the top performance of our two area hospital systems. Penrose-St. Francis Health Services received a rank-

Three keys to data-driven revenue growth

Reach Out and Read Colorado

With more than \$1.5 trillion in revenue, the U.S. nonprofit sector represents more than 5 percent of the nation's GDP (The Nonprofit Almanac 2012). As such, the industry is burgeoning — and competition for charitable giving is at an all-time high. Current trends indicate this challenge will accelerate; the number of registered nonprofits has grown approximately 60 percent during the past decade, and the IRS is approving 99 percent of applications for public charity status (Strom, 2009).

Given such saturation, it is imperative that nonprofit leaders embrace best practices in fundraising in order to survive and thrive in this environment. Fundraising is part art, but the science side of the business reveals that data-driven planning will out-produce contemporaries who employ an ad hoc approach across the board. Successful organizations continually exhibit such an understanding and application of proven strategies in revenue growth.

During more than 10 years in the philanthropic sector, I've found a common scenario where a small, struggling nonprofit convenes a board and conducts an in-house strategic planning process. Internally, there is profound belief in the leadership and mission, and recent financial setbacks are rationalized as bad breaks. Despite a lack of fundraising expertise, they often emerge from such sessions emboldened with a surefire blueprint: Hold a special event, recruit

corporate partners, invest in donor acquisitions, use social media to attract millennials, and write a big grant. This approach is myopic in design and does not generally consider powerful industry data, invariably proving fruitless.

Regardless of an organization's focus — be it education, health, independence, animal welfare, or myriad other causes — it can grow its revenue base by adopting a strategic blueprint. Of course, not every organization looks identical and can follow an exact path to financial growth. An organization must do an honest self-assessment and determine opportunities that are viable for the present and future. Yet savvy leaders will begin this assessment by considering some philanthropic truisms: older donors give more and more often than younger donors, federal government grants are complex with a low likelihood of success, 10-20% of donors often comprise 80-90% of total revenue, corporate philanthropy represents only 6% of total giving, and special events are deceptively unprofitable in most forms.

This article examines some key fundraising premises and analytics that should form the core of any development plan.

Segment your donor base

Define what a 'major donor' is for your organization. Don't simply apply an arbitrary number; instead, customize it in a way that is reflective of the impact of the gift to the size of your budget. A basic method of deriving a figure is to work backwards, beginning with your top do-

nors, and stop when reaching 80-90 percent of your budget. This is your threshold — and it is specific to your organization, be it \$25,000, \$2,500, \$250, or anything else. Major giving is inherently diverse depending on your donor infrastructure; I've worked with different organizations where major gifts have ranged from \$500-\$25,000! Once a level is established, develop an appropriate plan for how to treat this group. Allocate staffing in a way that is consistent with the theory of your plan. A deliberate cultivation and communication plan — complemented with diligence and time required to suitably honor major donor relationships — will greatly augment future solicitation opportunities. Major donors represent the greatest opportunity to grow revenue and are financially the most cost-efficient fundraising outlet. Take the long-term view, as it can often take up to two years to complete this sales cycle.

Identify emerging champions. Once a major donor level has been established, a moves management plan should be formed with a benchmark of upgrading existing donors to give at this level. Make it specific, but grounded in realism; increasing the number of major donors by 10 percent year over year is an impressive goal. Similarly, developing a pipeline that can project major donor upgrades in future years is extremely valuable for revenue forecasting. Use your existing major donors as exemplars for identifying these emerging prospects. In fundraising,

ing in Healthgrades America's 50 Best Hospitals, and both Penrose-St. Francis Health Services and Memorial Health System are currently seeking level 1 trauma certification, the highest level offered by the state's Department of Public Health and Environment.

Aging Population

According to the Milken Institute's *2012 Best Cities for Successful Aging* report, the Colorado Springs MSA has more than 65,000 individuals aged 65 or older; more than 10 percent of the population. By 2015,

that population will increase to more than 82,000. It also ranked Colorado Springs 39 out of 200 large cities for successful aging for individuals aged 65-79, and USA Today named the city a top place to retire.

Fast Facts

Colorado nonprofits earn \$17 billion in revenue & hold \$30.5 billion in assets, according to John Hopkins University, 2012

In Colorado alone there are nearly 19,000 nonprofit organizations that employ more than 142,000 nonprofit professionals or 8 percent of the workforce.

The nonprofit sector in the Pikes Peak Region is sizable and has a wide footprint in the economy.

Nearly thirteen hundred 501(c) organizations based in El Paso and Teller Counties filed an IRS Form 990 during the 2010-2011 period. (This does not account for those who operate here but do not file here.)

Four out of every five nonprofits in the Region are relatively small with annual revenues less than \$1 million.

Nonprofits based in the Pikes Peak region employ an estimated 18,000 workers nationally and had total expenditures of \$2.58 billion during the 2010-2011 period.

pragmatism beats idealism every time: Think about what your major donors look like, not necessarily what you would like them to look like. Remember, yours is not the only charity that has a 'plan' for attracting young donors to your cause, or for soliciting your volunteer base. All else equal, the data tells us that donors 65+ donate on average the largest annual gifts (Blackbaud, 2013). Your emerging champions have likely been with you for at least three years, have upgraded their giving, and have some type of connection to your work. Campaign or themed solicitations can be a great opportunity for upgrading these donors to major giving levels.

How big is your base? This is the core of small dollar donations that cumulatively forms the foundation of your giving pyramid — the annual donors who give under \$100. Here, you're looking for the most efficient means of securing gifts, with the annual appeal as a prime outlet. Some analyses show that for organizations with operating budgets under \$3.5 million, the annual fund can represent anywhere from 12 to 30 percent of total annual revenue (Wealth Engine, 2013). If you're well positioned, this group will be robust in size (ideally at least 1,500 active within 24 months); if not, growth from this segment will be very modest.

Build from the inside-out

Your best prospects are already on board. Use segmentation strategies discussed above to identify your champions, prospects, and core and message accordingly. Donor acquisition is expensive — reasonable cost guidelines widely cited at \$1.00-\$1.25 for every \$1.00 raised (Greenfield, 1999). You will typically lose money in new acquisition efforts, which generally pay off long term only when target populations are large.

New donors are often whimsical givers. Fewer than 3 of every 10 new donors to your organization will repeat their giving (Association of Fundraising Professionals, 2011). A sudden spike of new donors in response to a community need/immediate call to action can make an impact on current revenue, but its long-term impact is minimal. Give the

greatest attention to those in your file who have donated more than once, and within the past 24 months.

Leverage your champions. Your major donors can do much more for you than supply a large annual gift. They are your first point of contact in conversations about new ideas, growth, and opportunities. Capital or program-specific campaigns provide you with a unique dialogue to engage champions in new ways of involvement that go above and beyond a yearly donation, allowing a tangible chance to upgrade giving in a way that would not otherwise be possible. Similarly, their participation can singlehandedly make or break the campaign. In one study of capital campaigns, it was demonstrated that the percent of the lead gift in relation to the overall goal had a direct impact on success or failure (United Way of Dane County, 2005). Champions can also be called upon to present challenge or matching gifts for a given objective. Research indicates that simply announcing a match increases both the likelihood of donor response and the average amount per gift (Karlan & List, 2007).

De-emphasize special events

Prolific fundraisers — for the catering industry. In their 2007 Special Events Study, Charity Navigator found that for the over 5,000 organizations they studied, special events cost \$1.33 for each \$1 of revenue they generated.

Gross profit is only part of the story. Seldom is net profit of an event reported, as agencies prefer to revel in the success of a high gross figure (never mind the high typical expenses required to generate this figure). Yet even the net profit is a misleading indicator of event success, as this figure does not account for the indirect costs (i.e. staff time and expense, opportunity costs from other pursuits) associated with months' worth of planning. This is a comprehensive analysis that should be undertaken internally.

If you inherent a successful event, maximize its production. On some occasions, an organization will have a successful annual event that is longstanding, well enjoyed by its constituents, and tangibly profitable — as a rule 10-30% of gross annual revenue (some small organizations exceed this further, raising virtually all charitable dollars from an annual

event). While the data indicates strongly that events are not a revenue panacea, this is not a prescription for complete extermination. If your organization has an existing event that is producing, use this as an opportunity to maximize its impact on the revenue bottom line. Examine sub-revenue streams within the event to evaluate design tweaks that can increase ROI.

These keys are not simply theoretical constructs; they are based in empirical data from thousands of nonprofit organizations, leading philanthropic institutions, analysis of millions of donors, and industry experts. I've used these principals to transform multiple years of budget deficits into surplus, to set revenue records, and to lead organizations away from heavy reliance on grant funding by establishing individual giving as the top revenue source. The data is rife and can be applied to grow your budget today and tomorrow.

they did. Yet close examination of most nonprofits will find typical business practices solidly in place, from strategic plans to budgeting, financial record-keeping, audits, HR policies, marketing, legal compliance, and more. In fact, close examination of any nonprofit's IRS Form 990 will show that it must operate much like any business, and it must show positive net revenue to survive.

Our country and our community need the nonprofit sector. In economic terms, nonprofits fill a gap and, just as importantly, their programs and services enhance the quality of life in our communities. But to be deserving of the public trust with which they are endowed, nonprofits must also be transparent in their operations. For our missions to be found worthy, we owe it to the public.

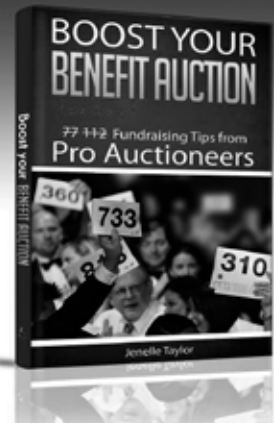
